The Studebaker National Museum was established to be the center for education, preservation, and interpretation of design and innovation. SCOPE OF VOLUNTEER DUTIES

Program support volunteers assist museum staff in facilitating educational programs, primarily the Driven to Design LEGO racetrack program, for school groups and other organizations.

QUALIFICATIONS

- Must be comfortable working with children.
- Be able to project a welcoming, cheerful attitude.

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

- Attend two yearly training sessions
- Familiarize oneself with the Driven to Design LEGO Racetrack program
- Familiarize oneself with the Museum layout

SKILLS OR CERTIFICATIONS

- Comfortable with speaking with a variety of Museum visitors.
- Ease with accomplishing a number of tasks

TIME COMMITMENTS

Driven to Design support commit to be available to assist with 12 or so sessions across any calendar year. This will vary significantly based on demand and time in the school year calendar. The Driven to Design program is heavily booked during April, May, and December sometime 10am-5pm, Monday-Friday.
